The Cody Regional Health leaders, staff, and providers immediately came together to develop a plan to ensure the safety of all of our staff and patients. We were successful in attaining CARES funding through the State Lands and Investment Board to enhance the safety and level of care we provide to our patients.

Most important, through all the challenges CRH experienced in 2020, we came together as an organization with strong support from our patients and community to make a positive difference in the lives of all those we serve.

TeleStroke Wyoming

Cody Regional Health (CRH) and Wyoming Medical Center (WMC) began a new partnership in 2020 to bring TeleStroke Wyoming to our local Emergency Department. TeleStroke connects our local ER physicians in Cody with WMC neurologists to collaboratively devise the best treatment plans for stroke patients in real-time!

Life-saving stroke care is measured in minutes. Time is brain, and the faster the blocked blood vessel is cleared, the better the chance for a patient's survival and recovery. While studies show that treatment times decrease and treatment choices improve when a neurologist is involved early in the care of a stroke patient, few Wyoming hospitals have 24-hour neurology coverage.

TeleStroke Wyoming allows WMC neurologists to actively participate in patient care and decision making from the moment the patient arrives at Cody Regional Health.

Having neurologists involved early increases the likelihood patients will get the appropriate diagnosis and treatment quickly, and that's the metric of excellence in stroke care.

WMC's TeleStroke partners are equipped with InTouch Health's Vici robot at no cost to CRH. The Vici is a scalable, mobile cart system that can be rolled into any patient room. From Casper, WMC neurologists can examine and speak with patients and ER physicians at Cody Regional Health through the high-definition cameras and display monitors. They can zoom in or out or swing their view from the side to side to ensure a complete field of vision. The system shares a patient's history, vital signs, and other data in





real-time in consultation with the on-site physician.

Stroke is the fifth-leading cause of death and the leading cause of long-term disability in the United States. One in

every three strokes occur in people younger than 65. Advancements in stroke care over the last several years have vastly improved patient outcomes, but that treatment must be started quickly.



There are basically two ways to treat an ischemic stroke—the kind in which a clot blocks blood flow in arteries leading to or in the brain:

IV administration of the clot-busting medication tPA (tissue plasminogen activator) within the first 4 ½ hours after onset of symptoms.

Mechanical thrombectomy, removing the clot from the brain with a specialized stent and image-guided technology, performed by the Interventional Radiology team. Wyoming Medical Center is the only hospital in the state with this capability. New guidelines have extended the time window for mechanical thrombectomy by up to 24 hours for some stroke patients, and TeleStroke will help facilitate the quick transfer of qualifying stroke patients to Wyoming Medical Center.

ACT FAST

When it comes to stroke, time is of the essence. If you or a loved one shows any of the signs of a stroke, act F.A.S.T. Call 911 immediately.



Ask the person to smile. Look to see if one side droops or the face is not symmetrical.

Have the person raise both arms in front of them at shoulder height. Watch to see if one arm drops lower than the other.



Ask the person a question or to repeat a phrase back to you. Listen for slurred or garbled speech or signs the person doesn't understand what you have asked of them.



If any one of the three signs is present, time is of the essence. Call 911 immediately. Do not attempt to drive to the hospital yourself. Emergency medical responders will activate the stroke team on the way to the hospital, saving valuable minutes. Stroke truly is one of the most time sensitive emergencies—it's like a heart attack of the brain. Every second your brain is not receiving oxygen during a stroke, 32,000 brain cells die. or 1.9 million cells die each minute.



Thomas J. Reid, III MD, PHD, FACP

Cody Regional Health is excited to welcome Dr. Thomas Reid, our new medical director of medical oncology/hematology at the Big Horn Basin Cancer Center, to our medical family; specializing in the practices of Hematology and Medical Oncology.

Dr. Reid is originally from Harrisburg, PA where he earned his BS in Microbiology at Pennsylvania State University and Ph.D. in Biochemistry at Purdue University. He earned his MD at the Uniformed Services University of the Health Sciences in Bethesda, MD and completed internship and residency in Internal Medicine and fellowship in Hematology-Medical Oncology at the Walter Reed Army Medical Center (WRAMC), Washington, DC.

From 1991 to 2004, he was at the Walter Reed Army Institute of Research, Chief of Blood Research the last three of those years. His primary research interests were extended storage of blood products/substitutes and coagulation disorders.

From 2004 to 2008 he was Chief of Hematology-Medical Oncology at the WRAMC. As Chief, he also served as Chair of the Cancer Care Committee, Co-Chair of the Institutional Review Board, and Principal Investigator (PI) for Cancer and Leukemia Group B (CALGB).

After 27 years in the Army Medical Corps, he retired in 2008 as a full Colonel. From 2008 to 2011, he was in private practice in Conway, Arkansas.

From 2011 to 2012, he was Chief, Hematology-Medical Oncology and Oncology Program Director at MedStar Good Samaritan and Union Memorial Hospitals in Baltimore, MD. There, he also served as Co-Chair of the Clinical Research Committee at the Lombardi Cancer Center, Georgetown University Medical Center.

Beginning January 2013, Dr. Reid has served as the Medical Director of the Memorial Regional Cancer Center and Chief of Hematology-Medical Oncology at

Memorial Hospital in South Bend, IN (Beacon Health System) where he built the cancer program.

In addition, he was the Chairperson of the Cancer Care Committee as well as the local PI for Alliance (Alliance for Clinical trials in Oncology) through the Mayo Clinic. Dr. Reid was instrumental in the Beacon Health System becoming a member of the Mayo Clinic Care Network in 2016.

Dr. Reid is board certified Medical in Oncology, Hematology and Internal Medicine. He has two sons, Christopher and Tristan, daughter-in-law Kathleen, and two grandsons, Lucas and Roen. COVID-19 Efforts

In order to best protect our patients, staff and community members, Cody Regional Health applied for a State Lands and Investment Board (SLIB) grant, and was approved \$1,121,250 for a new Operation Room (OR) Air Handing Unit.

The OR Air Handing Unit replacement will allow CRH to care for COVID-19 positive patients in a sterile environment.

The OR Air Handler Project includes new infrastructure including UV lights to kill airborne pathogens, HEPA level final filters to capture airborne pathogens, temperature control interlocks to activate negative pressure in any of the OR's during high risk procedures and new exhaust fans.

It is Cody Regional Health's goal to maintain the safety of our employees and patients while providing the best care in this ever changing environment. This project is essential to our mission and will allow us to continue to care for the residents of the Big Horn Basin and travelers to our area while mitigating the risk of increased transmission of COVID-19.

We partnered with Sletten Construction to complete this project before the end of 2020.







The State Loan and Investment Board (SLIB) of Wyoming awarded Cody Regional Health roughly \$4 million this last year in Coronavirus Relief Grants to assist with a variety of needs in order to combat COVID-19.

Cody Regional Health received funding for the following projects:

Long Term Care Center Tables & Rehab Equipment \$80,925

This equipment was awarded to CRH's LTCC residents during the COVID pandemic to help keep them active and healthy. CRH's LTCC also received funds to purchase new dining room tables that can be cleaned and disinfected in contrast to their current dining room furniture.

EMS Power Load Grant \$225,128

This new equipment will allow CRH's EMS personnel to be protected during

patient care and transport and avoid staffing shortage during the COVID-19 pandemic. The current method of transporting patients requires EMS personnel to be properly placed at all sides of a cot when loading a patient. This requires staff to get within 6-12 inches from the patient. It also requires the EMS team to lift sometimes an excess of 400 pounds causing injury to clinical personnel.

Home Health Vehicle \$29,102

This new vehicle allows CRH Home Health personnel to visit vulnerable patients in their homes. Since the pandemic, the CRH Home Health department has seen an increase of over 71% in in-home visits.

Telehealth Project Grant \$395,588

In order to improve access to comprehensive medical care through Telehealth while reducing the risk of COIVID-19 exposures to citizens, CRH is expanding its community paramedicine team in order to assist with in-home patients through telemedicine.

6 Demystifier 200A w/ transport backup units \$52.590

This portable negative pressure tent allows healthcare providers to safely house patients with infectious diseases including COVID-19.

Payroll deficiencies

\$1.3 million

In order to offset massive payroll costs due to COVID-19, these funds helped to alleviate a major financial burden on CRH.

EMS Equipment (TOTALING) \$300,397

LifePak 15

These monitors are utilized for the transport of patients who require continuous monitoring. This includes Non-invasive B/P, EKG, 12-Lead, SPO2, CO Monitoring, and temperature monitoring.

GlideScope Go

These are video Laryngoscopes that allows our provider to visualize airway anatomy through a camera during critical airway procedures.

Lucas System

This is a compression system that performs CPR, this allows our staff to reduce their exposure during Cardiac Arrest events.

Zoll EMV Ventilators

These ventilators are equipped to provide oxygen therapy to critically ill patients including CPAP/BIPAP.

5 Xenex disinfection ultra violet lights \$506,750

These lights pulse ultraviolet light to kill all pathogens within a closed room, including COVID-19.



Mental Health

During COVID-19, substance use and mental health conditions have skyrocketed. Our state of the art facilities and world class treatments at Cedar Mountain Center have been able to continue treating and helping those in need this year. With over 90% of our services now being offered through telemedicine, we are the most comprehensive and integrated program in Northwest Wyoming.

TMS is a non-invasive treatment that is used to treat psychiatric conditions. TMS uses a magnetic field to stimulate a specific target region in the brain that controls mood. It is used to treat symptoms of Major Depressive Disorder (MDD), by activating the neural pathways.

The advanced technology comes in the form of a helmet that is worn during treatment.

Treatment for MDD occurs five times a week for four weeks, and then twice a week for an additional 12 weeks as needed for maintenance.

About 40% of individuals suffering from depression are shown to be treatment-resistant, meaning antidepressants are either ineffective or carry unbearable side effects. TMS has proven successful in more than half of those with treatment resistant depression. Many who showed successful results from the trial, achieved full remission with Deep TMS.

New Dining Experience

Cody Regional Health's nutrition and clinical teams have fired it up in the kitchen. Our new dining experience, called UnitHost, launched on September 29, 2020, where our medical providers and registered dietitians work closely together to order diet protocols for patients and residents.


During orientation to the room, our nurses evaluate the patient's ability to participate in the UnitHost program. Patients review the UnitHost menu located in the room (at their bedside table) to make their meal selections. Our team meets with the patient after admission to take their first meal order and daily thereafter.


Our team works closely to determine the best system to coordinate medicines with meals when required. The UnitHost will also directly communicate with nursing and coordinate meal delivery based on specific patient needs.

Menu selections are modified during preparation to meet the patient's nutritional needs and the Kitchen Expediter reviews the completed meal prior to delivery for accuracy, appearance, temperature, quality and compliance with diet indicated on the ticket.



Executive Chef, Doug Williams, moved to Vegas and worked as a Sous Chef in many James Beard Award Restaurants. He received his Pastry Arts Certification from Le Cordon Bleu. Later he moved back to Oregon to be the Executive Chef at a 4 Star, 4 Diamond Salishan Resort on the coast.
